



- Accreditation:** The only private, parochial elementary in Northern Kentucky to be SACS (Southern Association of Colleges and Schools) accredited. Kentucky Department of Education accredited.
- Type of School:** Private-Catholic school for boys and girls sponsored by the Benedictine Sisters of St. Walburg Monastery who founded the school in 1904.
- Location:** Villa Hills is in Northern Kentucky, about 15 minutes from downtown Cincinnati, Ohio 10 minutes from the Greater Cincinnati Airport.

- Students:** Students primarily from the three Northern Kentucky counties of Boone, Campbell and Kenton and a few are from Cincinnati.
- Curriculum:**
- Full-day kindergarten with teacher/student ratio of 1/9
 - Nurturing atmosphere centered on The Benedictine traditions of hospitality, respect, reverence, peace, scholarship, service and community
 - Specialized teachers use differentiated methods of instruction and assessment in order to meet the individual needs of each student
 - Progressive curriculum includes computers, foreign language, art, music and physical education for grades K-8
 - Primary and intermediate students are in a mixed-grade environment for enrichment classes one hour per week. This is in addition to regular physical education, library, art, music, drama and computer classes.
 - Choice of instrumental music or chorus is available for junior high students.
 - Advancement to high school level courses is offered to junior high students in foreign language and math, with Latin offered in eighth grade
 - High school level computer classes taught in junior high.
